4B Zuccoli Class

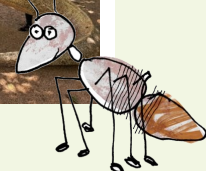
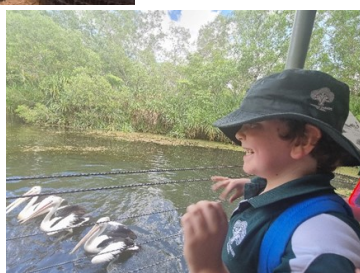

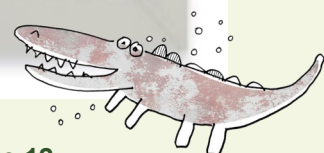
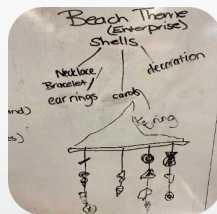


This Term HSP Satellite have been creating shell art inspired by their Guided reading text, "Storm Boy".

Students brainstormed ideas, brought their ideas to life, chose prices and sold their products every Tuesday at 2.15pm, from week 7- week 10.

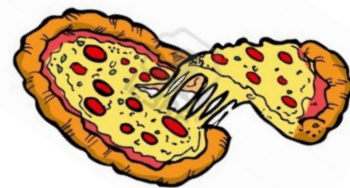
They were very excited by the kind words and support from all that came to look and/or purchase from them. They enjoyed helping people choose their purchases and worked on receiving money and calculating customers change.

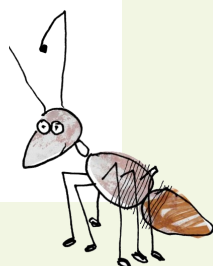
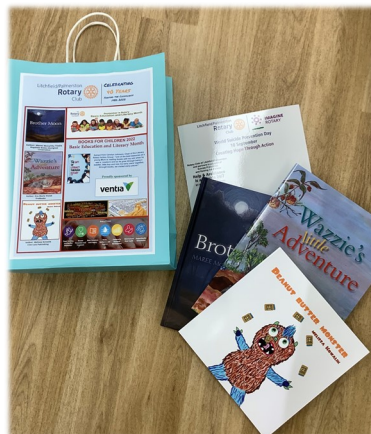

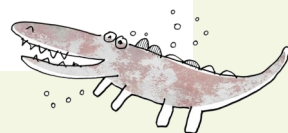
