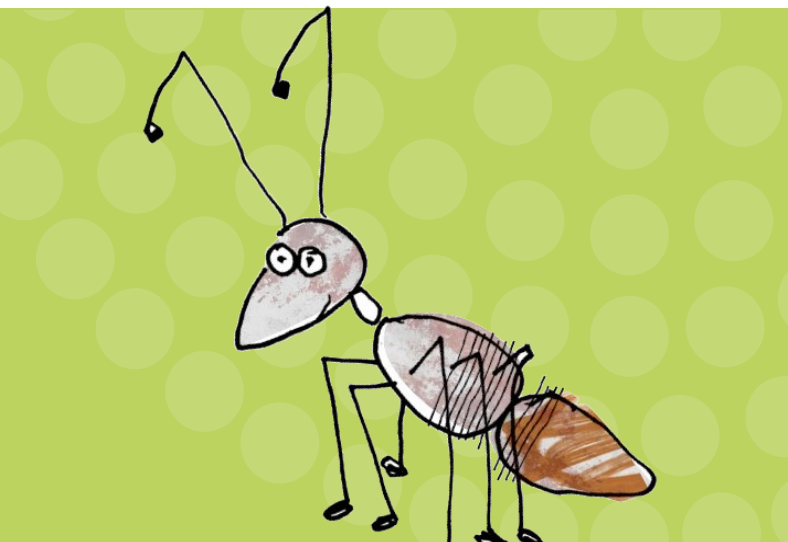
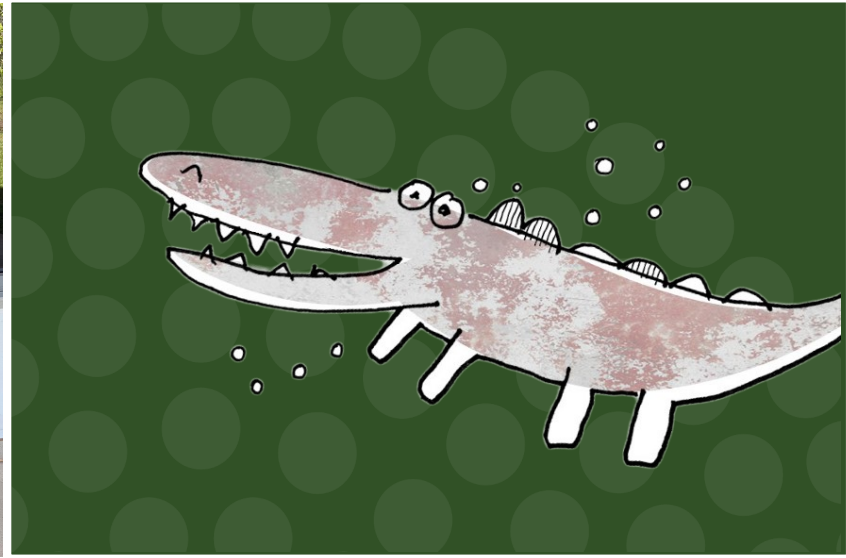

As part of our work on the FPS Orderly Learning Environment we have been working on a context statement:

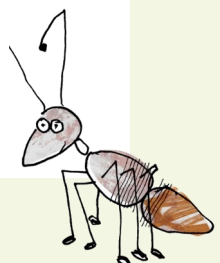
*Forrest Parade is a Comprehensive Literacy / POKD School. Our commitment is to provide every child with a readiness to learn, a voice and a pencil.*

Students experience Inclusive Education when they can access and fully participate in learning, supported by reasonable adjustments and teaching strategies tailored to meet their individual needs. Inclusion is embedded in all aspects of school life and is supported by culture, policies, curriculum, and everyday practice. (Adapted from the Queensland DoE Inclusive Education Policy Statement)*

I want to take this opportunity to say how proud I am of all our students. It has been tremendous to see the personal progress they have made over the course of the year, and I look forward to seeing the gains the students make in Term 4. We hope you enjoy our photos!

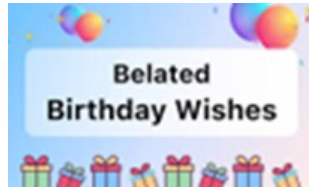

2B has been learning about Earth and Space Sciences such as day and night, light, cloud, sequencing of the planets, weather and moon.

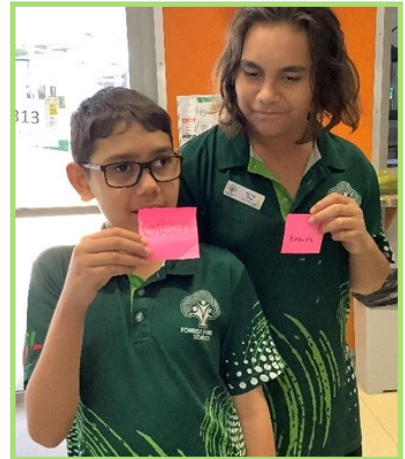
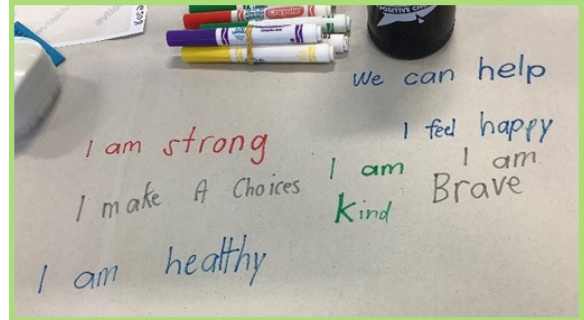
Our students participated in class STEM activities and cooking to further their understanding of the topics.



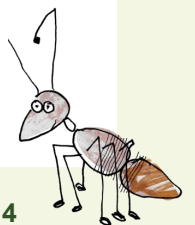

We have also been learning and doing great things with our Maths and Literacy, focusing on 'time' and working in group to improve our reading skills.

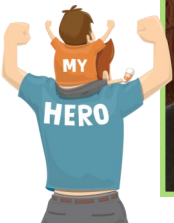

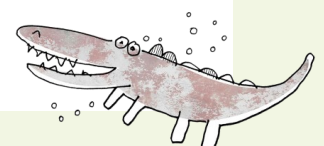


## Rosebery Satellite

## COMPREHENSIVE LITERACY

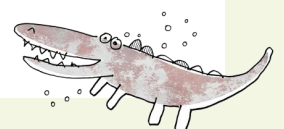


Forrest Parade has reached another important milestone on our Comprehensive Literacy Journey.
